



# CBL International Oxford Summer Institute at Oriel College



## **Economics and Management Programme Outline 2012**

CBL International (Centre for International Business and Commercial Law) and Oriel College, University of Oxford are inviting groups from selected Schools of Economics and Schools of Management/Business to participate in a 4-week session of CBL International Oxford Summer Institute at Oriel College, University of Oxford (UK), co-hosted by Oriel College and CBL International.

**Two sessions will be held in Oxford:**

- **Session 1: from 1 July to 28 July 2012**
- **Session 2: from 29 July to 25 August 2012**

*(On request, alternative starting dates and the duration of the programme can be adjusted to the requirement of individual university groups)*

The programme will give all participants the opportunity to attend cutting-edge lectures on International and European economics as well as international management and international relations. Delegates will appreciate our strong focus on global economic trends, international dispute settlement and international trade. This programme is the only extensive Summer Institute in Oxford that focuses on international economics and management as well as international relations and law.

CBL International Oxford Summer Institute at Oriel College is a programme with a very interdisciplinary approach. Therefore students from the following departments and schools are invited to join:

- School/Department of Economics
- School/Department of Business and Management
- School/Department of Law
- School/Department of International Relations
- School/Department of Public Administration and Governance
- School/Department of Foreign Language Studies (Legal/Business English)

Each 4-week session of Oxford Summer Institute will be composed of four courses. Each week, one course will be taught. Combining lecture time, preparation, study time, and tests, each week is designed to be equivalent to 2 - 3 ECTS credits or 1 – 1.5 US credits, in total of 8 - 12 ECTS and 4 - 6 US credits. During each week a test is offered to the delegates.

The following courses will be offered during the programme:

- 1. Global Macroeconomics:** This course will cover important subjects on macroeconomic fluctuations in China and the West, fiscal policy and debt dynamics in the world economy, exchange rate policy and global demand imbalances, international inflation performance and consumption and savings in the global economy providing delegates a clear picture of today's global economic performance and its challenges.

- 2. Financial Crises and Policy responses:** This course will first introduce participants with the banking systems and the financial crisis, making emphasis in the credit crunch and its effects on the real economy, to later transition into the sovereign debt crisis in Europe.  
This course will also cover subjects such as unconventional monetary policy and the banking reform as a result of the financial crisis.

- 3. Entrepreneurship & Business Management in the Financial Crisis II:** This course will give insights on international entrepreneurship and starting up businesses. Additionally it will describe how entrepreneurs and managers from small, mid size and large organizations are challenged by the new business climate after the financial crisis and today's globalization.

- 4. International Relations and Dispute Settlement:** This course will deal with the private as well as institutional enforcement of international commercial law, examining judicial and arbitration structures, which exist to resolve international disputes.

  - a. **World Trade Organization (WTO):** This lecture discusses the history, objectives, and institutional aspects (trade negotiations, decision-making, and dispute settlement) of GATT and the WTO. It also includes case studies and casework.

- b. **Association of South East Asian Nations (ASEAN):** These lectures focus on the history, goals, legal-political classification, the organizational structure, judicial dispute settlement, and the protocol on dispute settlement of ASEAN.

5. **International Taxation:** This course offers an in-depth understanding on international taxation as well as various aspects of taxation in cross border transactions.
